LIBERTY TOWNSHIP ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA RESOLUTION NO.: 2022-05

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A NON-CDL EMPLOYEE OF THE TOWNSHIP TO OPERATE COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES IN A SNOW OR ICE EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, 75 Pa CSA Section 1606 (b)(8) of the Pennsylvania Vehicle code provides that a driver who is 18 years of age or older and employed by Liberty Township may operate a commercial motor vehicle within the Township without a commercial driver's license within the boundaries of Liberty Township for the purpose of removing snow or ice from a roadway by plowing, sanding, or salting, if:

- a.) the properly licensed employee who ordinarily operates the commercial vehicle is unable to operate the vehicle; or
- b.) the Township determines that a snow or ice emergency exist that requires additional assistance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Liberty as follows:

- 1. The Chairman of the Township Board of Supervisors, the Township Administrator, or the Township Roadmaster shall have the right to make either of the following determinations: A.) A snow or ice emergency exists within the Township that requires additional assistance,
 - A.) A snow or ice emergency exists within the Township that requires additional assistance, or
 - B.) The properly licensed employee who ordinarily operates a commercial vehicle for the purpose of removing snow or ice from a roadway by plowing, sanding, or salting is unable to operate the vehicle.
- 2. Once the determination as set forth in No.1 of this Resolution is made, then the Chairman, Administrator or Roadmaster shall have the right to authorize a Non-CDL Employee of the Township 18 years of age or older to operate a commercial motor vehicle for the purpose of removing snow or ice from roadways within the Township by plowing, sanding, or salting.
- 3. The Chairman, Administrator or Roadmaster shall be required to complete the attached "Temporary Authorization for Township Non-CDL Driver to operate a CDL Vehicle" and said authorization shall be kept in the vehicle being operated by the Non-CDL operator.
